Emergency Shelters Prepare for More Rain

Two Emergency Shelters Open for Homeless Residents in Downtown Los Angeles and San Fernando Valley

Los Angeles, CA - December 16, 2014 - Hope of the Valley Rescue Mission has two cold weather shelters now open offering 132 beds, hot showers, hot dinner and breakfast, case management and a secure and warm place to sleep.

WHERE:

Pacoima: Greater Community Missionary Baptist Church 11066 Norris Ave. (Includes 5 p.m. pick up in Glendale at 5101 San Fernando Rd. and 5:30 pick up in Sun Valley at 8165 San Fernando Road.)

Downtown Los Angeles: Skid Row on the 4th floor of the Weingart Center on the corner of San Pedro and 6th Street.

WHEN:

The cold weather shelters open at 6 p.m. and close at 7 a.m. Walk ins are first come first serve.

During the day those seeking shelter are brought to our Access Center where we provide not only warm shelter and a hot lunch, but also access to computers, case management, support classes and more to help move people out of homelessness.
